I love being at Wellington High and apart from the joy of the job I love coming across stories of our past heroes. I started the newsletter in this way at this time last year and want to again this year.

One of the interesting things that has happened is that Massey University in taking over the Wellington Polytechnic has embraced the history of the Wellington College of Design, which morphed into Wellington Technical College, as their history. The nice thing is that they acknowledge that it is a shared history with Wellington High having its foundations in the same creative, design, technological roots. At times I feel our history has been a little hijacked but I am coming to see there are more positives to come out of sharing.

Last year Massey started a hall of fame for their College of Creative Arts and have begun a tradition of inducting three high achievers each year. Last year Rebecca Taylor, fashion designer, was a Wellington High old girl, as well as a Massey alumni, and this year artist Gordon Walters was inducted. He attended Tech from 19351940 as a teenager and adult student. His stylised Koru and other pictures began a new era in New Zealand art. The really nice thing is I was able to go upstairs into our old file and find his record card and even nicer we have one of his prints hanging outside my office.

We at High do indeed have a proud tradition.

I have just returned from French Pass with a group of Yr 10 students and the great thing about such experiences is that I see students in a totally different light. I also get some time to think about them and about how well everyday school may fit their needs. I am increasingly convinced that our key role is teaching students to be great learners. It is their ability to learn and to go on learning all their lives that is the most important skill we can instill. The confidence to give things a go and learn from trying things the resilience to keep trying so that when they get stuck they know what to do to solve problems. It was the kids with the beginnings of these skills who shone on camp.

The annual prize givings, both senior and junior, are a rewarding way to end the year. It is a real joy to celebrate students' success with family

and friends. We acknowledged academic excellence across the school.

TOUGHLOVE offers parents strategies that work. The tough part for parents is accepting that change is more likely when they first try to change the way they respond to their teen, rather than trying to change their teen's behaviour. Parents are shown the techniques for making such strategies effective. This helps parents cope with feelings of despair.

Kids need to know where the boundaries are, and parents need to be consistent with consequences when boundaries are crossed. Inconsistency allows kids to develop manipulation skills which often lie behind the reasons why parents contact *TOUGH*LOVE. Parents need to renew their confidence to deal with the pressures of unacceptable behaviour.


