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## Nga Korero o te tumuaki

Have you heard of that game "broken telephone" where a message gets distorted as it is passed round? Well that's what happened last week. I spoke to Nathan Beaumont from the Dompost about school balls and found a story headlined WHS cancels ball over drunken hijinks - a very different slant on the conversation. I said that we no longer had a mid-year ball and now just had one ball at the end of the year called the Leavers' Ball, for Yr 12 & 13 only. It is held after the exams and is a fairly formal affair. I said we stopped the mid-year ball because some younger students found it difficult to behave properly and we all wanted to enjoy the event not spend our time acting as policemen. Where he did get me right was about the effect of pre-ball parties in students' homes that resulted in inebriated students arriving at the mid-year ball, some of whom behaved obnoxiously. Last year after a couple of years of this mid-year behaviour and the bitter disappointment of the student ball organisers we decided to focus on one ball at the end of the year.

I have had varied reactions to the headline. Some say good on you! WHS shows how to draw a line! Others - how mean to punish this vear's students for behaviour of last year's students! reactions have validity. I am sad that we have lost our point of difference – two balls, one guite casual more a mid-year party and the other more formal. Two important things to remember though. Firstly we all have to work together to make sure the Leavers Ball is a huge success with sober students celebrating and secondly, sometimes it only takes the behaviour of a few to wreck something for everyone.

Last week I showed Jim Corder, the Principal of Lytton High school in Gisborne, around our school. As we wandered in and

out of classrooms he was impressed by the way the students were focusing on their learning, the positive, friendly relationships between students and teacher and the way the teachers were facilitating learning rather than instructing from the front. All the things that we espouse as good teaching and learning were obvious to Jim, an experienced, knowledgeable principal on sabbatical. I always feel so proud when I take someone around the school like this. We have so many teachers leading the way as they use modern pedagogy – teaching skills – to ensure students are learning.

Last week at a ceremony at Parliament I was awarded a NEiTA Cognition award for excellence in Leadership. The Board nominated me for this National Excellence in Teaching Award last year. As part of the process last week I had to make a presentation to a selection panel. I started it by saying - Kia ora I am one of many leaders at Wellington High School - a wonderful school across the city. And that's what I am; one of a set of wonderful leaders here at High. I am constantly humbled by the depth of our teachers' knowledge about teaching and learning, their willingness to be learners themselves and the energy, enthusiasm and stamina that they show as they work to ensure every student here has a chance to achieve to the best of their So my award is our award. Well done Wellington High School!

And well done Shakespeare! Yet again students have produced a wonderful rendition of a Shakespearean play. Directors Kiri Olds and Vanessa Cullen brought Midsummer Nights Dream to life for all of us and each actor did a superb job. This was followed by a superb Music Evening with over 100 students performing their own and others' music with polish and flair. Thanks Kris Twigley and her crew.

### Free Dental Care - Year 9 to 13 students

The Government recognises the importance of dental health by providing FREE dental care to ALL adolescents up to the age of 18 years.

We are pleased to advise that the Capital and Coast District Health Board has funded **Simply Dental NZ** to provide FREE dental services at our school. Their services will be available to all students who elect to be seen by **Simply Dental NZ**. The first visit will occur from Monday 31 May to Friday 11 June. We anticipate they will see between 250 and 300 students with priority given to year 13 students, then year 12 and 11 students. If your child is not currently enrolled with, and visiting, another dental provider then they are able to receive free dental care from **Simply Dental NZ** when they visit. Free care is available up to a person's 18th birthday, but a free check-up will be provided for those who are already 18.
