PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Kia ora and Greetings

Term One has ended on a very high note following a busy few weeks that has

seen lots of action in the school. Students are leaving to travel to Nepal and Indonesia, we have had parents interviews and have continued great work in the classrooms, supported by innovative professional development opportunities for our staff. There have been significant student achievements that are outlined in the body of our newsletter. Although students and staff are ready for a holiday they can look back on a very successful term. I would like to thank families for their support of the school in all that we do.

As we have worked through this term we have been looking carefully at student profile data, which helps inform the decisions we make in all aspects of school operation and performance. There is one piece of data that stands out, and this provides a real challenge. In 2013 NCEA Level 1 results show 100% success rate for students who attended 95% or more of all their lessons. The correlation of attendance and achievement is plain and therein is the challenge. As students progress through the senior school their attendance rate drops, so the ability to succeed with confidence can be compromised. We need your family's support in ensuring that your youngster attends every scheduled lesson every day. The outcome of this focus on attendance is clear.

Another way families can support us is through making the voluntary family contribution to the school. The money generated by this donation is very important to us as it allows us to provide many facilities, especially in terms of technology, that we need to provide a twenty first century learning environment. I urge you to make this contribution if you have not already done so. We do appreciate this support and use the resource wisely.

I would like to pay tribute to a group of families, staff and students who have supported the school in a very unique way. A couple of weekends ago a group of enthusiastic whanau members spent two days painting Taraika. In that time the whole interior was repainted along with the front face of the whare. The difference this has made is enormous, and provides a clean canvas for the decorative treatment that is being undertaken in time for Taraika's 20th anniversary in November this year. In closing I thank all families for their support of the school. I wish you all a very happy and safe holiday and look forward to seeing you all in Term Two.

REPORTING 2014

This year reporting has moved to an online format to reflect the ability of the parent portal to provide you with assessment information as it happens throughout the year.

JUNIOR REPORTS (9-10)

Each term students will complete a self review of how they are working towards attaining the necessary learning skills for success in the future. This will be posted on the portal at the end of week 8 each term. In addition, teachers will post grades and a comment in each of the student's subject areas. This should provide rich feedback on top of what a student receives in class to enable the next steps. Grades possible at a junior level are: Working towards the level, Achieved, Achieved with Merit, Achieved with Excellence or In progress. These relate to the 'aspirational' curriculum level at each year which is level 4 for year 9 and level 5 for year 10 with the exception of languages.

SENIOR REPORTS (11-13)

In terms 1, 2 and 3 a student's subject teachers will rate students in terms of their Academic Progress, Classwork and Learning Behaviour. Students will either be Doing Well, Meeting Requirements or Causing Concern. These one page reports will be posted on the portal at the end of week 8 each term. In addition, teachers will post grades and a comment in each of the student's subject areas as per junior reports. Grades for senior reports will be either Not Achieved, Achieved, Achieved with Merit, Achieved with Excellence or Not Assessed. Yet

ANAROA HILL UPDATE

On 17 and 18 March, Year 12 and 13 Ag/Hort students carried out the first harvest of Pinot Noir and Pinot Gris on Anaroa Hill Vineyard.

They then transported the harvest to Eastern Institute of Technology and started the wine making process; destemming and crushing, water pressing, yeast inoculation and fermentation.

The grapes were tested around 20-21 brix for sugar content and tasted great and the red Pinot Noir is being fermented and aged with French oak chips from Allure Forest.


On the second day the students carried out wine analysis for acid strength and quantity, and bottled last years Gimblett Gravels Merlot.

Then we visited Mission Estate in the middle of their Sauvignon Blanc harvest. Students got to view wine making by the truck load, new technology and innovations, processing equipment, and oak barrel storage in the winery.
