Morgan Christy – Jones has just received a Gold CREST Award for creating a food product using tagatose sweetener. Morgan spent two years on the project and was mentored by Professor Steve Flint, Massey University. Morgan's CREST project helped to provide evidence for her NCEA assessment and she also received a Scholarship award on this project. This year she has commenced her studies in Food Technology at Massey University in Palmerston North.

CREST is an international awards scheme designed to encourage years 0-13 students to be innovative, creative, and to problem solve in science, technology and environmental studies. Morgan was the only student in NZ to receive a Gold CREST Award in 2012.

NCEA Scholarship Results 2012



In the 2012 NCEA Scholarship exams, 16 WHS students obtained 23 Scholarships across16 subjects, with Outstanding Scholarships in Biology, Geography, Mathematics with Calculus and Physics. Learning Conversations Wednesday 27 March

Learning conversations are being held on Wednesday, 27 March for all students. The learning conversation is an opportunity for a student, their caregiver(s) and their roopu teacher to review the student's start to the year in all subject areas and then set goals for a successful year. A typical learning conversation will last for about 20 minutes and interview times start at 8.30am and continue at half hour intervals throughout the day with the last interview at 4.30pm. The interview can be booked at http://www.schoolinterviews.co.nz (there is also a link to this on the parents and caregivers menu on moodle) using the code **FA9NF**. Follow the steps to book your interview with your student's roopu teacher. Note that teachers are grouped by year group. **Please note** that there will be no formal classes on this day and students should only be at school for their learning conversation.

Reports 2013

Year 9/10

There are three types of reports that your students will receive in Year 9 and 10.

- 1) Term 1 progress report this will be given out at the learning conversation meeting on Wednesday, 27 March and will give you a quick indication of whether a student is on track or not in each of their subjects.
- 2) Whiwhinga reports these are sent home and posted on the portal each term. Whiwhinga reports give you and your student an indication of whether a student is acquiring appropriate learning behaviours to set themselves up for success.
- 3) Progress reports these are comprehensive reports which indicate the level of progress made across all of a student's subjects. These will be posted on the portal and given out at the end of year junior prizegiving.

Year 11-13

Senior students will receive three reports

- 1) Term 1 progress report as for junior students, this will be given out at the learning conversation meeting on Wednesday, 27 March and will give you a quick indication of whether a student is on track or not in each of their subjects.
- 2) Term 2 Progress report this is a comprehensive report indicating the level of progress made across all of a student's subjects. These will be posted on the portal and mailed home at the end of term 2.
- 3) Term 3 Report this reports on a student's progress on their school exams. School exams are practice for externals that a student will sit at the end of the year.

In addition to these written reports, learning conversations will take place twice during the year - once in term 1 (Wednesday 27 March) and in Term 3 (Thursday 12 September).

Mathletics

All students in year 9 and 10 have Mathletics subscriptions as part of their course. If there are students in other years who would like to have access to this site for the next year (till February 2014), they need to pay \$30 to student services. When they have done this, see Mrs Lewis on level 3 and she will organise their username and password and set them up with whatever curriculum level work they want. The site can be accessed from school and from home and caregivers can be given access as well if you want to monitor your student's progress.
