



Te Kura Tuarua o Taraika ki Pukeahu Yr 11 2024

Changes to the qualification

Year 11 course in 2024 will:

- Provide experience of NCEA by each course assessing 1 standard
- Provide broad foundational knowledge and the skills needed to prepare for specialisation at NCEA levels 2 and 3
- Not provide enough credits to gain the NCEA Level 1 qualification

Rationale

- Shifting the focus to learning as opposed to assessment
- Longer learning time (last day for Y11 will be 29 November)
- Opportunity to explore more inclusive forms of assessment
- Protecting the wellbeing of students by reducing the unnecessary burden of 3 yrs of NCEA national assessment
- Provide greater flexibility for courses
- Build foundational knowledge to enable success at year 12 and 13
- From 2024 all old L1 assessments will have expired and using the new assessments will be mandatory

Assessments

- Will be a mix of class tests, assignments, etc and ONE NCEA assessment (using NAME).
- Some of the NCEA assessments will be internally assessed, some will be externally assessed.
- Some students will need to sit literacy and numeracy exams if they have not gained the co-requisite in year 10
- NCEA exams will run from 5 Nov 29 Nov. Students will continue to have normal lessons during this period and sit exams if / when they occur (depending on what courses they choose)

Year 11 Course of study

Year 11 must study:

- English and / or Te Reo Māori
- Mathematics or Numeracy
- Any other four courses (selected in ropū over the next week)

Co-requisite

 In 2024, learners will need to achieve a 20-credit co-requisite using either the new literacy and numeracy, or te reo matatini and p\u00e4ngarau standards. At WHS, if the \u00e4konga are ready to be assessed this will be in Year 10.

OR

an approved list of literacy and numeracy-rich assessment standards to be awarded an NCEA

If learners meet the NCEA literacy and numeracy requirements before the new Level 1
achievement standards are phased through (prior to 2024), this achievement will be recognised
towards the new co-requisite.

Changes to Level 2 and 3

To gain NCEA Level 2, you must achieve:

- 60 credits at Level 2 or above, and
- 20 credits co-requisite literacy, numeracy, te reo matatini, pāngarau or
- 10 numeracy credits
- 10 literacy credits

To gain **NCEA Level 3**, you must achieve:

- 60 credits at Level 3 or above, and
- 20 credits co-requisite literacy, numeracy, te reo matatini, pāngarau or
- 10 numeracy credits
- 10 literacy credits

^{*}New standards will be mandatory in 2026 for level 2 and 2027 for Level 3
