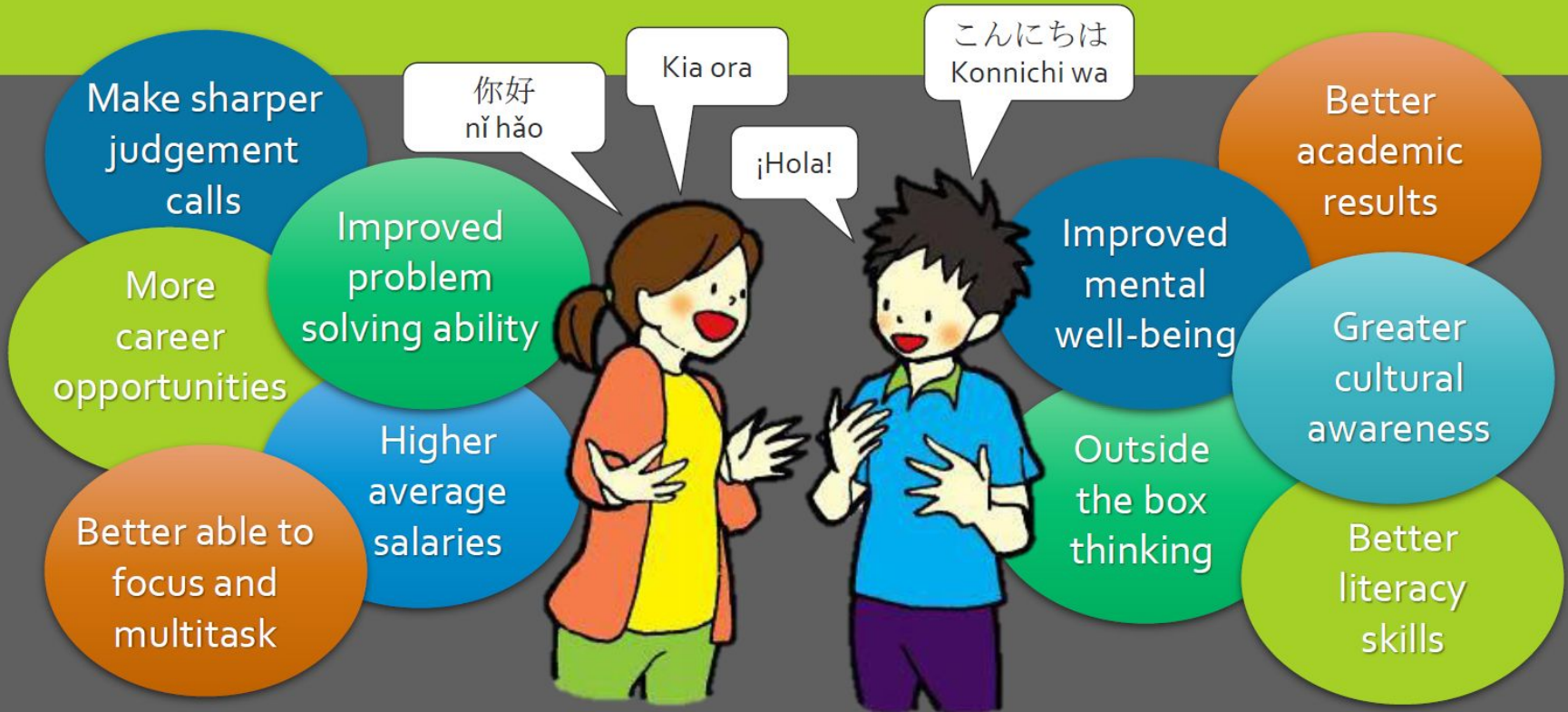


LANGUAGES IN THE SENIOR SCHOOL

- All languages are available to do at NCEA Level 1, 2 and 3
- Each has a mix of both internal and external credits which are similar at each level



10 BENEFITS OF BEING BILINGUAL



JAPANESE, SPANISH AND CHINESE INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS

- Speech – 4 credits (L1&2), 3 credits (L3)
- Conversation Portfolio – 5 credits (L1&2), 6 credits (L3)
 - Students record a number of conversations throughout the year and choose their best 2 to submit at the end of the year
- Writing Portfolio – 5 credits (L1, 2 & 3)
 - Students submit 2 pieces of written work in the appropriate language at the end of the year

JAPANESE, SPANISH AND CHINESE EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS

- **Listening – 5 credits (L1, 2 & 3)**
 - Students listen to 3-4 passages and answer questions in English based on what they have heard
- **Reading – 5 credits (L1, 2 & 3)**
 - Students read 3-4 passages and answer questions in English based on what they have read.

TE REO MĀORI INTERNALS

- Whakarongo (Listening) – 6 credits (L1), 4 credits (L2 & 3)
 - Students listen to a range of passages and answer questions on them
- Kōrero (Speaking) – 6 credits (L1, 2 & 3)
 - Students create a portfolio including a speech and a conversation in Māori
- Waihinga tuhinga (Writing portfolio) – 6 credits (L3 only)
 - Students write 2 pieces in Māori

TE REO MĀORI EXTERNALS

- Panui (Reading) – 6 credits (L1, 2 & 3)
 - Students read 3-4 passages and answer questions based on what they have read.
- Tuhi (Writing) – 6 credits (L1, 2 & 3)
 - Students choose one of a range of topics to write about

MĀORI PERFORMING ARTS

- Available for students from Year 10 -13
- Standards vary from year to year depending on the skills that will be developed in depth that year, but will be around 20 credits
- Differing standards mean that students can continue taking the subject in subsequent years
