What does this mean for your subject choices and timetable lines for 2022?

You will have noticed that most courses are 2 days a week. This does have an impact on your subject choices and timetable lines to



EG 1: If you choose a 2 day course, you should choose 3 subjects to take at school

Construction Mixed Trades (P) Mon/Tues 51 Plumbing, Painting, Electrical, Construction

The course is on Mon/Tues (this means Line 1&2 doubles are missed) ... so you must choose 3 subjects - 1 each from Lines 3,4,5

EG 2: If you choose a 2 day course, you should choose 3 subjects to take at school

Creative Technology (W) Thurs/Fri 43 Design fundamentals, new media, Indigenous design

This course is on Thurs/Fri (this means that you miss Line 4&5 doubles) ... so you must choose 3 subjects – 1 each from Lines 1,2

EG 3: If you choose a 1 day course, you should choose 4 subjects to take at school

Health Sciences (P) Thurs 20 Health Sciences – infections, support and well being

This course is on a Thurs (this means that you miss the double on Line 4 ... so you must choose 4 subjects - 1 each from Lines 1,2,3,5
